Their church is actively involved in creation care activities in their area, and they enjoyed and added vitality to our worship that morning. And the 12 of us from RUCC were a vibrant part of the congregation, as well.

The RUCC Creation Care team will be planning future outdoor worship services and other outdoor activities that will continue to nurture our love of creation and enhance our sense of unity with all God's good creation. We'll keep you posted!

In the meantime, Creation Care ministry will take a hiatus in August, a sabbath month of rest, a siesta, from planning and conducting activities. We pray that all of you find rest and renewal as you "consider the birds of the air and the lilies of the field", as you revel in the beauty that is our desert homeland, remembering all those humans and animals and plants that have and now also call this land "home."

Your Stewardship and Finance Ministry Team appreciates your solid financial support of Rincon Congregational Church's ministry and programs through the first half of 2019. Income is meeting expectations and thanks to extra individual effort we are reducing expected expenditures.



Status of operating funds At the year's halfway point we contributed \$156,877 toward a plan of \$156,947 helped by your support of the Bridge Pastor Fund (BPF) which stands at \$18,000. Pledged receipts are about four percent ahead of target. Expenditures amounted to \$171,567 for the same period. Our year-to-date deficit is \$14,690, which is less than expected. Our unrestricted general fund reserve for operations is \$123,927.

Besides the BPF donors, please thank those ordained members who provide dedicated pastoral service while we await the arrival of our selected interim minister, and those musicians that perform each Sunday with the help of Dr. Tentser, Rich Smith and Dave Buss.

There are several things we can all do to help ensure solid future for Rincon and its ministries: continue to promote among our associates the marvelous work of Rincon in the community, invite people to come and worship with us, and note that friends can make a financial contribution to those efforts on the RinconUCC.org website.

<u>Rincon Migrant Shelter</u> The Shelter, under the leadership of Sarah Reed, has received year-to-date contributions and grants of \$19,204 against expenditures of \$16,311, for a net reserve increase of \$2,893. This doesn't account for the many in-kind gifts such as food, clothing, toiletries that the congregation and community has provided. Many thanks to the hands that care for these hopeful people.




